When Aspenites Katherine and Rally Dupps traveled to Bali in 2009, they had little idea that they, and their two children, would end up calling the country home for five years. And even less of an idea that they would establish a successful textiles company there, **Katherine Rally** (katherinerally.com), which produces batik fabric that is made into pillows (\$200) and also sold by the yard (\$100). Rally free-draws intricate patterns that are duplicated as a

copper stamp. Per the traditional batik method, which originated in Indonesia, the stamp is then dipped into molten wax and the design applied to raw fabric. The Duppses recently moved back to Aspen (though will travel to Bali to oversee the business) and also landed their first in-town account: Aspen Design Room (625 E. Main St., 970.544.2055). Look for several new patterns this summer, including Maroc, medina, Oahu, diamond, etoile and Damascus, each available in 26 colors. —Cindy Hirschfeld
